For our May 7 program, Dial Help's Clinical Director Katherine Cocciarelli shared with us the history and programs of Dial Help. Staffed by 13 employees, Dial Help is open 365 days a year.

Dial Help provides crisis intervention, victim services, prevention programs and family support services.

In 2009, Dial Help enters its 38th consecutive year of service. Dial Help provides confidential walk-in and telephone crisis intervention 365 days per year. Last year we responded to requests for assistance across the entire Upper Peninsula. Issues addressed include relationship problems, family support services, suicide, bereavement, substance abuse, and other stressful situations. Dial Help also works to prevent sexual assault and substance abuse by educating children about protective factors that build self-esteem and positive decision-making skills. Last year our prevention programs served elementary and high school youth in Baraga, Houghton, Keweenaw, and Ontonagon counties.

The mission of Dial Help is to promote the physical, emotional, and social well-being of our communities by providing problem assistance, crisis intervention, referrals, education and training.

The philosophy is to "help people help themselves" by providing immediate, accessible, and affordable services to the communities we serve.

Dial Help's Crisis Unit is staffed by professional, trained employees who are available to provide assistance to community members every day. A variety of crisis intervention services can also be accessed through Dial Help's Helpline.

The crisis intervention helpline is available to residents of Michigan from 9 PM to 9 PM Monday through Friday, 12 Noon to 12 Midnight on Saturday, and Sunday 4 PM to 12 AM. Walk-in crisis intervention provided by the Crisis Unit is also available.

Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) advocates are on call to respond immediately to off-site crisis intervention requests for victims of sexual assault. Advocates may meet victims at a police station, the hospital, the Dial Help office, or other appropriate locations. SART advocates may respond to requests for victims in Houghton, Keweenaw, Baraga, and Ontonagon Counties.

The Victim Services Unit, a Dial Help program in collaboration with the Houghton County Sheriff's Office, has advocates who are on call to respond immediately to requests for crisis intervention and assistance. This is available to victims of a crime or crisis such as car accidents, fires, drownings, suicides, or any other disasters or catastrophes.

The community Critical Incident Stress Management Team can also be accessed through Dial Help's Helpline. The CISM Team responds to requests for crisis intervention debriefing for groups with post traumatic symptoms following a crisis event.
